

Directions

This activity is well-suited for lamination for long-term use. You can also use this file to help children practice their cutting and gluing skills.

Cut the picture on the first page into rectangles, including the numbers below for younger learners. Have a child then either glue or velcro each piece of the puzzle onto one of the two grids below. The first grid includes numbers, so younger learners can easily match the numbers and discover the picture. The second grid offers a more challenging option.

If laminating, use velcro (such as 0.59" diameter self-adhesive dots) to secure each piece of the puzzle to its designated column. I recommend attaching both halves of the velcro to the grid background pages first so that you can align them evenly. Then align the puzzle pieces themselves and adhere them to the pre-placed velcro.

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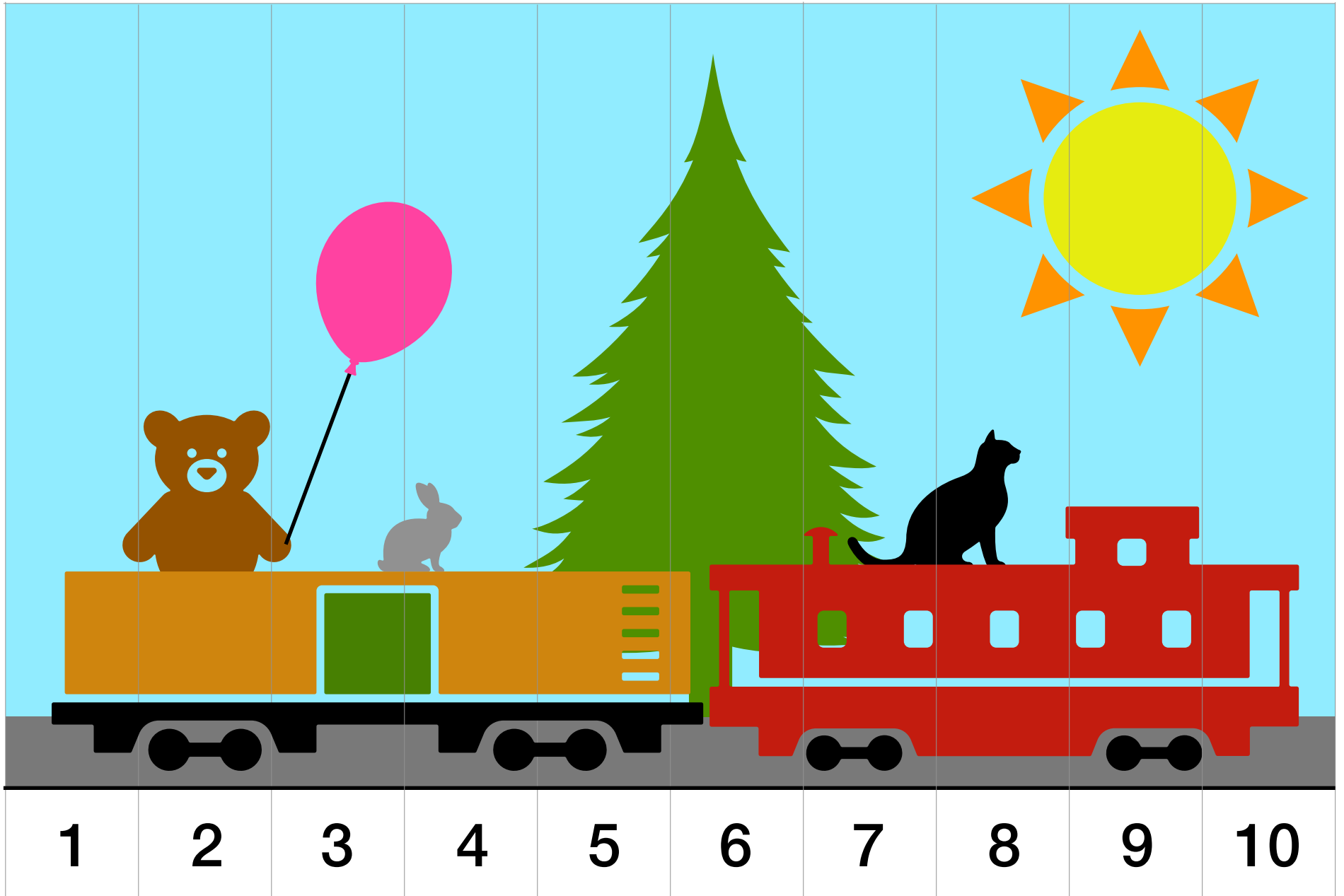
